

## Lesson 2: Paragraphs

### Task 1:

The first thing you will need to do is to open your work from last lesson in both Notepad++ (or Notepad) and a browser (Google Chrome or Edge etc.)

The easiest way to do this is to open Notepad++ and then go to file and open and locate your work. It might even still be open from last time if you are using the same computer!

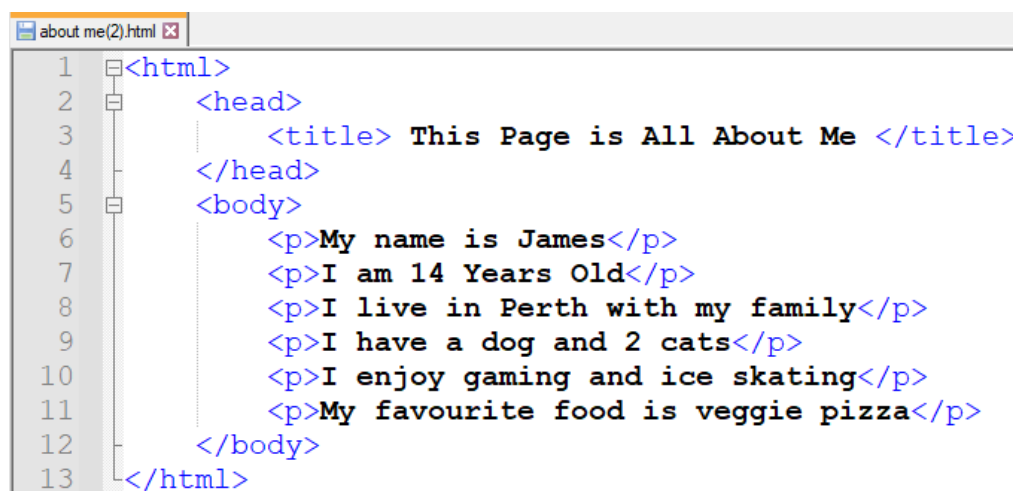
Then from your folder, double click on your work to open it as a webpage.

### Task 2:

The first thing we are going to do is to add `<p>` tags around each of our pieces of information.

Remember you will need a `<p>` at the start of the line, and a `</p>` at the end.

It should look something like this (remember you might have put in different information):

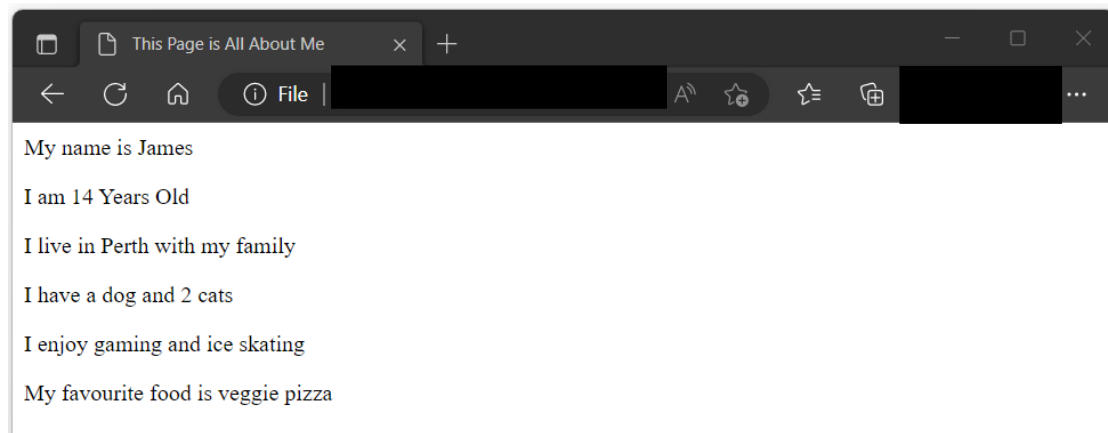
To see if it has worked, you will need to save your HTML file – either go to File and Save, or click the small blue square Save icon.

You don't need to Save As because you're just updating what is already there.

Then refresh your internet browser with your webpage on it.



Your webpage should now look like this:



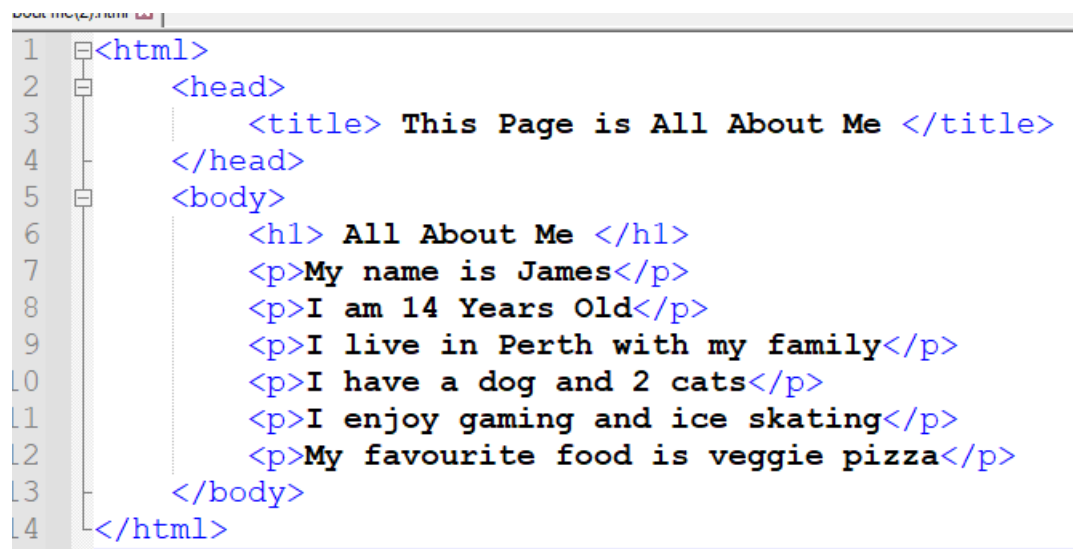
### Task 3:

Now we are going to use some heading tags to give our page a bit more structure.

Remember that `<h1>` is the biggest, and then `<h2>` is the next biggest and so on.

After the `<body>` tag on line 5 add a new line in and add the following:

<h1> All About Me </h1>
```



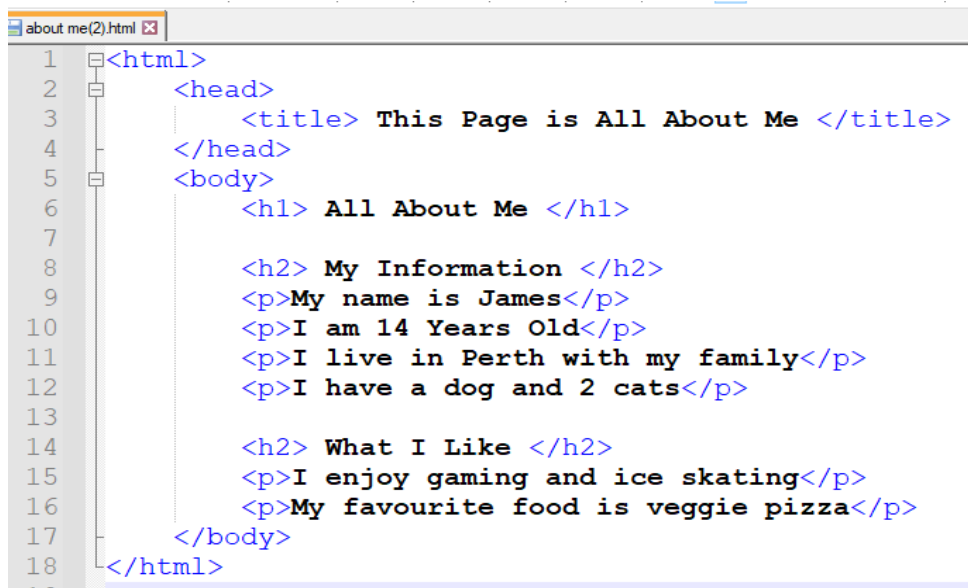
Save your HTML page and refresh your webpage – has the new heading appeared? Is it in the right place?

## Task 4:

Finally let's add a couple of <h2> tags to give our page some sub-headings.

I have added a "My Information" heading, and a "What I like" heading. Depending on what information you have added, you may want to add different headings, or perhaps even more headings.

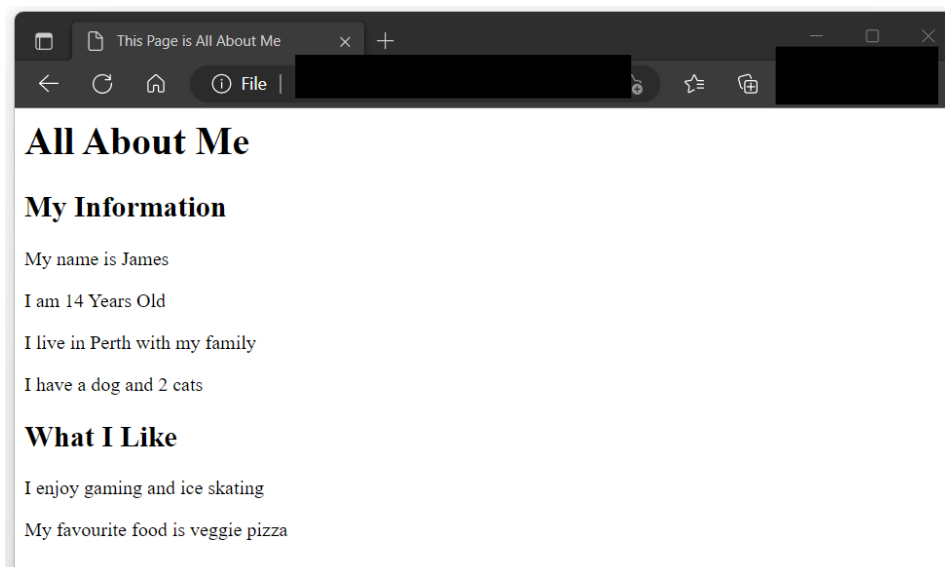
It should end up looking something like this:

Save your HTML page.

Your webpage should now look like this:
